Film Heritage Recommendation The history

- Recommendation of the European Parliament and of the Council on film heritage and the competitiveness of related industrial activities
- Commission proposal of 16/03/2003
- Adopted by the European Parliament and the Council on 16/11/2005
- Legal basis: EC Treaty (Articles 157 and 151 TEC).



Film Heritage Recommendation

- Political signal at EU level: film heritage matters
- New impulse to Member States action
- <u>Transparency</u>: Bi-annual reports from Member States + monitoring from the Commission
- Learning from each other



Film Heritage Recommendation Implementation Reports

- Member States are recommended to inform the Commission every two years of action taken in response to the Recommendation.
- First Implementation Report of 8/2008
- Second Implementation Report of 7/2010
- Third Implementation Report due in 2012
