## Elements to be considered by CSD on a Review Arrangement on Energy for Sustainable Development

- 1. Devoting in [2009] [2011] and [2013] [2015] a separate segment of its session to review and follow-up the implementation of its decisions on energy for sustainable development;
- 2. Reiterating the commitment of the JPoI to substantially increase the global share of RE sources with the objective of increasing its contribution to total energy supply and regularly evaluate available data to review progress to this end;
  - Calls upon the [XX] within the group of relevant bodies<sup>1</sup> to coordinate collaboration and seek guidance as necessary from governments, intergovernmental organizations, industry, civil society and other stakeholders, and report to governments at the X<sup>th</sup> session of Commission for Sustainable Development in [2009] [2011];
  - This review of renewable energy would *inter alia*:
  - Collect, verify, and validate data on the share of renewable energy in the total energy mix; planned and enacted policies; investment trends, market share, fund flows; based on existing data wherever possible;
  - Identify best practices and success factors, analyze gaps and barriers, and suggest opportunities to accelerate development of renewable energies;
  - Prepare recommendations for consideration at X<sup>th</sup> session of Commission for Sustainable Development in [2009] [2011] and other relevant fora;
- 3. Furthermore decides to broaden the review arrangement to energy efficiency and calls upon [XX], in cooperation with all relevant bodies, to prepare a report outlining the modalities for this broader review arrangement at the XX<sup>th</sup> session of Commission for Sustainable Development in [2009] [2011];
- 4. Furthermore decides to broaden the review arrangement to access to energy services and calls upon [XX], in cooperation with all relevant bodies, to prepare a report outlining the modalities for this broader review arrangement at the X<sup>th</sup> session of Commission for Sustainable Development in [2009] [2011];
