OECD Statisticians Satisfaction Survey 2003

Introduction

In 2001 the OECD launched a new statistics strategy. Since then, several initiatives have been undertaken to raise the profile of statistics vis-à-vis OECD stakeholders and top managers, and to improve the quality of OECD statistics and the efficiency of statistical processes. One of the objectives of the OECD Statistics Strategy was to "improve the skills and the quality of work of those involved in statistical activities". Several initiatives have been undertaken to achieve this target, both from a technical and organisational point of view. As the first phase of the statistics strategy comes to a close, the time has come to evaluate the working conditions of OECD statisticians and to what degree they have been affected by the Strategy.

The aim of this survey is to measure, on a subjective base, to which extent OECD statisticians and analysts dealing with statistical products (henceforth synthetically indicated as "statisticians") are satisfied with their working conditions and to identify areas that require more attention and investment. The results will be elaborated to create a report for further analysis by OECD statisticians and managers in charge of statistical activities. The confidentiality of individuals is assured both by the procedures adopted for the collection of completed questionnaires and by the choice of classification variables. The questionnaire has been designed by the Statistics Directorate under the auspices of the Statistical Policy Group and tested by a small group of OECD statisticians. The survey has been approved by the "Commission on Computerised Information and Privacy". The electronic questionnaire has been developed by Monique Legroux, ITN.
