

ESA 2010 based benchmark or major revisions since 2014

2014

All EU countries carried out coordinated benchmark revisions to implement the new ESA 2010 methodology. This statistics explained article analyses the impact of ESA 2010 revisions focusing on nominal GDP at the European level: [Annual national accounts - how ESA 2010 has changed the main GDP aggregates](#).

2016

Bulgaria, Denmark, Ireland, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, and the [UK](#) carried out major revisions.

2017

Austria carried out a benchmark revision and the [UK](#) carried out a major revision.

2018

[France](#) and the [Netherlands](#) carried out benchmark revisions and the [UK](#) carried out a major revision.

2019

18 EU countries ([Belgium](#), Bulgaria, Germany, Estonia, Spain, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Hungary, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland, Sweden, and the [UK](#)), and Norway carried out coordinated benchmark revisions of national accounts. 2020

Four EU countries (Czechia, Greece, Malta, and Poland), Iceland, and Switzerland carried out benchmark revisions of national accounts (Greece only for 2010 onwards). Lithuania completed the 2019 benchmark revisions for the years before 2010. Latvia, Ireland, and Romania conducted major revisions. Luxembourg implemented a benchmark revision for financial accounts.

2021

Luxembourg carried out a benchmark revision for remaining national accounts tables. All EU countries, Iceland, Norway, and Switzerland have therefore carried out a benchmark revision of national accounts under ESA 2010. For details, please consult this [2020 and 2021 overview table](#).
