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Focus

Since addressing the grand challenges needs action in more areas than just research, all three elements of the knowledge triangle, including education and innovation, have to be taken into account.

As an example, in the renewable energy sector it is expected that the ambitious goals for increasing the share of wind energy will be impossible to reach due to a lack of trained experts and engineers in this field. All the ETP implementation plans should therefore include appropriate education and skills actions to ensure that the human resources needed for implementing possible solutions are available.

Just as some ETPs are already focusing on societal challenges, some ETPs are already actively incorporating education into their plans, but it is suggested that all ETPs and ETP clusters should engage in this exercise. While responsibility for higher education lies with national and often regional governments, it would be helpful for ETPs to do what they can to improve educational opportunities and environments.
