Focus

Speeding up the time-to-market of innovations is essential if Europe is to stay competitive, and the smart use of "demand-side" tools (such as legislation, public procurement and standardisation) can accelerate getting new products and services to customers, especially in growth markets linked to societal challenges such as eco-innovation and the "Silver Economy" (i.e., an ageing population).

Several ETPs are already working on these types of demand-side innovation activities, and this session will generate ideas about the possible roles and responsibilities that ETPs could assume in order to help address societal challenges in this way.

At last October's ETP conference, there was already some discussion on this topic. Now it's time to get concrete and find out what ETPs, businesses and research organisations can do, want to do, and perhaps don't want to do!

We've invited four speakers from different sectors to present case-studies of their experiences with demand-side tools. They're linked to ETPs involved in the implementation of the Lead Market Initiative or the Framework Programme.
