**1.2.1 – Preparatory Action:** Child Guarantee Scheme - Establishing A European child guarantee and financial support (2019\_04.037725)

#### **Objectives pursued and expected results**

This third phase of the preparatory action (PA) on establishing an implementing framework for a Child Guarantee scheme will follow on the first and second phases of this PA. The first phase of the PA consists of a feasibility study for four groups of vulnerable children. The second phase will be a policy and financial impact study on what would be needed in order to be able to extrapolate the conclusions of the feasibility study to larger groups of children in the EU.

The third phase will be dedicated to conducting experimental projects in selected EU Member States. These Member States will be determined at a later stage. This third phase will put into practice the results of the previous two phases, in order to test whether such a scheme could be made operational on the ground and upscaled in a cost-effective way and provide a new approach to reducing child poverty.

### Description of the activities to be funded

The experimental projects will specifically verify, under concrete and controlled circumstances, the feasibility, added value and cost-effectiveness of an EU-wide Child Guarantee, as well as its potential to reduce child poverty.

The experimental projects will focus on the following areas of action (1) education, (2) childcare and (3) nutrition, and will test how these would reduce poverty and improve well-being of children. The projects will last maximum 24 months.

### Type of applicants targeted by the direct award

The Commission intends to implement this third phase of the preparatory action by a direct award to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) on the basis of Article 195(f) of the Financial Regulation. UNICEF is an international organisation commanding a high degree of specialisation and technical competence in the area covered by the proposed action. It has the required operational capacity on the ground throughout the EU.

The explanation with regards to the fact that UNICEF meets the conditions of article 195(f) of the Financial Regulation, will be substantiated in the award decision.
