The Government of Ireland and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland agreed a Convention on Social Security that was signed at official level on the **1st** 

**February 2019**, and passed through all Parliamentary ratification procedures in both jurisdictions during **March 2019**.

The Convention was given effect in international law upon an exchange of diplomatic letters in accordance with Article 65 of the Convention, on the **31st December 2020**, being the date on which the transition period ended following the withdrawal of the United Kingdom from the European Union.

The Convention on Social Security was then given effect in domestic law on the **31st December 2020** by virtue of (SI 746 of 2020) Social Welfare (Convention on Social Security between the Government of Ireland and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) Order 2020.
