RESULTS – GOOD PRACTICES

- In January 2018, two months after the end of the support, 1,380 (65%) workers had found a job; 1,334 as employees and 46 as self-employed, while 388 (18.2%) were still unemployed.
- In addition, 72 (3.4%) participants were inactive (66 retired and another six doing some type of voluntary activity — charity or others —). There is no information available regarding 292 workers.
- Of those who found a job, 68% did it in permanent positions, and 21% got fixed term contracts of at least six months; while 8.2% got a variety of contracts (temporary, combined with training, etc.).
- In April 2019, additional 110 were back into employment: 100 as dependent workers and 10 as self-employed.
- All 2,132 dismissed workers participated the collective and individual information sessions. There were 1 959 workers who enrolled in job transition and accompaniment towards new jobs support. Later, 42 workers dropped out the measures.
