## BACKGROUND

- The 20% decrease in the number of pigs slaughtered in Denmark since 2005 is largely due to the fact that exporting piglets is more profitable for Danish farmers than fattening pigs for slaughter. This has led to excess slaughter capacity in the Danish Crown Group and the closure of the slaughterhouse in Sæby (a town within the municipality of Frederikshavn) and subsequent layoffs.
- The number of industrial and production jobs has decreased by 36% in the municipality of Frederikshavn since the financial crisis of 2008. The number of jobs available has also decreased at regional level in the period 2008-2023. Therefore, the employment lost due to the closure of the Danish Crown's slaughterhouse is a cause for deep concern.
- Most of the redundant workers have either low levels of formal qualifications or rather outdated qualifications and skills. In addition, 40% of the workers have a migrant background. These workers will particularly benefit from the additional and targeted support to find new jobs under the proposed EGF measures.
